FACTS AND STATS

What was the Compliance Grade for October 2024 state tobacco and electronic smoking device inspections?

Grade A

According to Idaho Code 39-5701, the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare must inspect each Permitted Retailer that sells tobacco and electronic smoking devices to ensure that it does not sell these products to customers under the age of 21.

How well did these Permitted Retailers comply with the law in October 2024?

- 268 Permitted Retailers were inspected. *
- 13 Permitted Retailers sold to the underage inspector.
- The compliance rate for October 2024 was:

95.15% TERRIFIC!

*Non-minor Exempt Inspections where purchase attempts were made.

TIME IS RUNNING OUT TO RENEW PERMITS

Your Idaho Tobacco and Electronic Smoking Device Permits will expire on **December 31, 2024**. **Renew your Permit for 2025 today!** Permit renewals can be completed online for **free** on the Idaho Tobacco Project (ITP) website - <u>TobaccoPermits.com/Idaho</u>.

Need help renewing?

We are here to help! Have any technical difficulties, questions, want help renewing, or need a copy of your permit? There are two ways to reach us:

- Send us an email through the "<u>Contact Us</u>" link on the <u>ITP homepage</u>.
- Call the ITP message hotline at 877-641-4468. Listen to the message options and then leave us a detailed message. Your call will be returned in the order it was received. Most calls are returned within 2 business days.

Renewal Reminders

- Permits are Not Transferrable. Remember that if you sell your retail location, your permit is NOT transferrable. The new owner must get their own Idaho issued permit.
- No Sales from Vending Machines. It is illegal to sell tobacco and/or electronic smoking devices from a vending machine in Idaho.
- Temporary Permits are not allowed. Permits for temporary markets, community events, fairs, tasting events, and mobile businesses are not allowed.

No longer need a permit?

Email us using the <u>"Contact Us"</u> feature on the homepage. In your email, be sure to indicate why you no longer need a permit. These reasons include Change of Ownership; No longer selling tobacco or electronic smoking devices; On an Indian Reservation; Out of Business; or provide us with another explanation.
